

Study protocol


 Participants were mailed maps showing one of two cities and a survey link.

 Participants performed tasks / rated quality of maps / rated their confidence using them.



How confident did you feel while using the maps to analyze flood risk?





How confident did you feel while learning the meanings of symbols on the maps?





How confident would you be in using similar maps to analyze flood risk in your own community?








